Over the past few weeks, we've hosted Zoom calls with alumni from several different past summer Whole Person Care Preceptorships. We're about half way through the 19 groups that we've trained. As we've re-connected, there's been the enjoyable updates of school, career, family, kids, and living location. What's been especially encouraging is hearing the many stories of how these Christ-followers are seeing their Christian faith being lived out in their lives today.

This one page space is insufficient to share everything, but please know God is working in and through so many who are now spread around the globe. Here are a few that you might enjoy...

- There is now a core group of med students in Puerto Rico who are helping train their classmates to do spiritual care.
- One student presented to pre-med honors students about the importance and value of spiritual care.
- A student shared about praying with a patient in front of her professor and most of the students in her class.
- Another student spoke out publicly about her faith even though her school has been hostile to Christianity, but not hostile to other faiths. Many of her classmates she did not know were Christians privately told her how her actions encouraged them.
- Other students are discipling classmates and leading CMDA groups. One is discipling a classmate from Iran.
- A student led a session on whole person care to his entire class of 140. Lots of interested generated.
- A 4th year med student spent most of his time at each of his residency interviews discussing spiritual care. He was selected to attend his #1 residency choice.
- A nurse serving with Youth with a Mission in Australia is helping integrate the the gospel into some of their medical mission training material and protocol.
- A pharmacist is serving as a foster mother for 3 underserved children. This single lady provides a loving, stable home where God is honored and taught. Plus another nurse and her husband are providing foster care as well.
- A physician working in a predominantly Muslim country is discipling and training Christian national physicians in western quality medicine. She is also training them to provide spiritual care to their patients.
- One geriatric physician is caring for and praying with his elderly COVID patients who are often left alone; another internist is praying with 99% of his patients.
