As Thanksgiving approaches, we want to convey appreciation to you from us and those you may never meet.

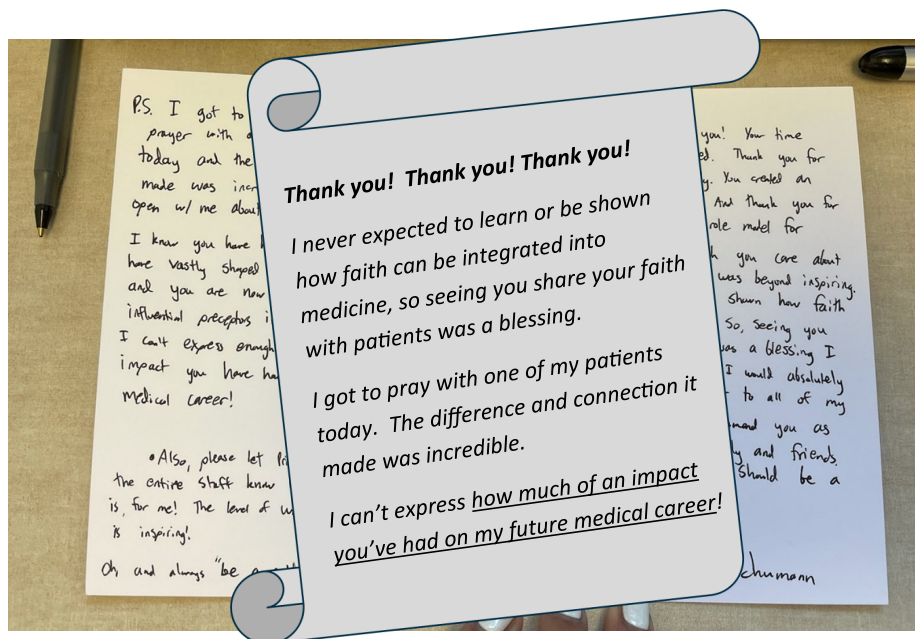
